## DRAFT ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2020

### 1. INTRODUCTION

This Annual Report on the working of the University has been prepared by the Executive Council for presentation to the General Council in pursuance of the requirement under Section 12(2)(iii)(a) of the NALSAR University Act, 1998. The period covered is the calendar year **from January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020.**

### 2. CHANCELLOR OF THE UNIVERSITY

**Hon'ble Shri Justice Raghvendra Singh Chauhan**, Chief Justice of High Court for the State of Telangana was Chancellor from April 3, 2019 to January 6, 2021.

**Hon'ble Smt Justice Hima Kohli**, Chief Justice of High Court for the State of Telangana is the current Chancellor of the University w.e.f. January 7, 2021.

#### **4. COVID-19: UNIVERSITY CHALLENGES AND RESPONSES - A BRIEF REPORT**

The sudden onslaught of COVID-19 pandemic leading to suspension of classes from 16<sup>th</sup> March, 2020 and lock-down of the university right in the middle of the semester had the full potential to derail the academic programme and pushed the university into deep crisis and uncertainty. However, due to the collective efforts of the students, teachers, staff and administration after a short suspension of three days, classes were resumed in an online mode. There were some initial struggles in selecting the platform for the online classes, as well as in getting accustomed to the platforms; however, both faculties and students settled down with online classes and the remaining classes of the semester were successfully conducted. In recognition of the fact that all students may not have internet bandwidth once they were back home, recordings of the classes were made available on class groups. In a show of solidarity, students posted class notes and pen drives to their batch mates situated in remote areas of the country where internet access was not available. Thus, the university could successfully complete all courses of the January-April 2020 semester as per its earlier notified schedule.

Cognizant of the personal and familial difficulties that students may be encountering at home, the Academic Committee shared the design of the June-October 2020 semester with the students and faculties before finalizing the same. The semester schedule, mode of execution of the classes, evaluation was settled after close consultation with the SBC as also other students who raised concerns on equity and fairness of online education. The semester design essentially was prepared in recognition of the fact that the nature of the problem that any member of the university community could face could not be completely predicted or addressed.

### **A) Waiver of mandatory attendance**

In recognition that not all students have the internet access or adequate bandwidth or limiting home environment, the mandatory attendance of live classes was not insisted upon. However, to ensure that students keep abreast of the developments in classes the pattern of continuous assessment was followed.

### **B) Online classes and supportive measures**

In an endeavor to make access to online classes as equitable and inclusive as possible, the following actions were taken:

- The University opted for CISCO-Webex instead of Zoom because it has a phone-in facility, making the classes accessible to many more people.
- The University continued with its policy of recompensing students and faculty for the upgradation of their data packs
- Pen drives carrying the recordings of the classes of the week were sent to all students who were unable to watch and listen in all the classes.
- Laptops were procured and loaned to students who were in need of them.
- In order to lessen students screen time, hard copies of the study materials were couriered to all students except those who had opted out of the scheme due to ecological preferences. The special needs of students with low vision were kept in mind in creating the materials.
- The classes were live recorded and such recordings made available so as to ensure that even students who could not attend the class or classes have the benefit of watching and listening in to class discussions.
- University invested around 3.43 crores on 1,74,503 e-Books so that students can have remote access to the library.

### **C. Nalsar Forums**

The Student Academic Committee created The FORUMS, a platform which served as repository of classes, reading materials and facilitated interactions and posting of questions and discussion forums for each course offered. DGV Rithvik played a leading role in conceiving and running these forums.

### **D. Tests and Evaluation**

- Four weekly tests and optional project submission was the evaluation pattern followed for mandatory courses.
- In the face of uncertainty that everyone was exposed to at the time, no student was compelled to take any test. Students were allowed to avail an option to write few tests during the ongoing semester and a few in December. No questions were asked or explanations sought from students who opted to stagger their tests in December.

The university was guided by equity and empathy in designing the academic program for the semester and these two values coupled with a spirit of

cooperation and collaboration helped us to navigate the January-April and July-October 2020 semesters.

Flexibility without compromising on the learning experience guided us in designing the semester for the newly admitted LLB first year and LLM first term students. University did not compromise on the number of classes required for each course but instead of asking the LLB students to do one project for each subject, they were asked to do one research project for one credit so that the skills of writing and research could be cultivated. University also opted for an intense semester for the new batches so that the academic calendar could come at par for the entire university. Consequently, for the earlier batches the University closed in October 2020 and for the new batches the class ended in December 2020 and examinations were conducted in January 2021. The university reopened for all batches on 18th January 2021 and the academic session is now on schedule.

Overall the University could avert a major crisis and delay in semester schedules by a collective effort of all the stakeholders in the system.

During this period, for the first time, the Student Bar Council (SBC) elections were also held seamlessly in an online mode.

As per the instructions of the Hon'ble Chancellor, the the Regular Faculty selections, Ph.D presentations and all the important meetings were held online without compromising on the University's procedures.

#### **E. Welfare measures**

University has tried its best to extend its helping hand to the Students and Staff during the unprecedented Covid-19 emergency:

- University gave 'COVID-19 Financial Assistance' to the tune of 3.74 crores to all the students including the students admitted in the academic year 2020-21 during the year under report.
- Scholarship amounts were drastically increased from from 40 lakhs to 75 lakhs.
- University Staff were paid full salaries during the entire period of lockdown.
- Full Wages were paid to House Keeping, Horticultural, Civil workers, and STP AMC staff.
- Minimum required security staff was deployed by providing them free accommodation and food at Campus and the remaining security staff were paid full wages.
- Rice & Vegetables were supplied to Construction Labours who were staying in Campus.
- University additionally compensated the Essential Services Staff members like Cooks, Electricians, Plumber, Carpenter & other cleaning staff etc. by paying Hardship allowance for their duties during the lockdown period.
- Mediated with the State Government Officials for sending the Construction Labours to their native places during lockdown period.

- To put all safety protocols in place at the campus, Sensor based Sanitizers, Sensor Type Bib Cocks, Pillar Cocks and Urinal Sensors are installed in some of the rest rooms in Administration Building, Academic Block, Library and Dining Hall. Stand Sanitizers were provided in all the buildings. Hand sanitizers & Vitamin Tablets were supplied to staff. Sanitization on regular intervals is being done using Hydroxychloroquine chemical based Spray sanitizers at Campus.
- University has initiated the construction of University Health Clinic with an estimated cost of 4.50 crores.

#### **F. NALSAR for Migrant Workers**

During COVID-19 pandemic situation, NALSAR alumni and students have come together to raise funds for the relief efforts to help migrant workers stranded across the country. This unprecedented crisis has caused several millions of workers to put their lives at risk to reach home. The collective, NALSAR for Migrant Workers, collaborated with government, transport service providers and civil society and helped the workers reach their homes safely and provided access to food and medical supplies.

The collective was involved in relief efforts in and around Bengaluru, Delhi, Chennai, Hyderabad, Coimbatore and many other areas from where requests for assistance have come in from – Asind (Rajasthan), Palakkad (Kerala), and Karimnagar (Telangana) amongst others.

### **5. APPOINTMENT OF OFFICERS, TEACHERS AND OTHER STAFF**

#### **A) Appointment of Professor Emeritus**

The Executive Council considering the academic experience, publications and other research contribution of Prof. Amita Dhanda and also considering her contribution to the University in various capacities, unanimously recommended to the Hon'ble Chancellor to appoint Prof. Amita Dhanda as Professor Emeritus w.e.f. December 1, 2020, after her superannuation as Professor at NALSAR.

As the admissions for the 2020-21 academic year were delayed due to the COVID-19, the semester for the said batch was scheduled between October 2020 – January 2021. As per the instructions of the Hon'ble Chancellor, the term of Prof. Amita Dhanda's was extended till January 31, 2021.

Prof. Amita Dhanda has joined as Professor Emeritus on February 1, 2021 after her superannuation on January 31, 2021.

#### **B) Appointment of Faculty on regular / contractual basis**

The advertisement inviting applications for various positions in Department of Law, Department of Social Sciences and Humanities & Department of

Management Studies was issued during May, 2018. As per the directions of the UGC, regular selection process was not held in any University during the year 2018-2019. In the meantime, the UGC notified new Regulations on Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and Other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education in July, 2018.

Due to some changes in the said Regulations, the University adopted the Regulations and prepared the revised application form and the formats for direct recruitment as well as for CAS. Accordingly, all the candidates who had applied earlier were asked to resubmit their applications. On the instructions of Hon'ble Chancellor, it is decided to hold online selection process.

Based on the academic record, teaching experience, performance before the Selection Committee, the following candidates **were appointed on regular basis** in consultation with the Hon'ble Chancellor in December, 2020:

## **7. ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES**

### **A) Consortium of National Law Universities**

The Consortium of National Law Universities conducted (CLAT-2020) smoothly during the COVID-19 pandemic situation on September 28, 2020. A total number of 75,183 candidates had applied for this test and 68,833 candidates had downloaded the admit cards in which 59,443 candidates finally appeared for the test. The attendance was 86.36% which was high compared to the attendance at JEE (Mains) / JEE (Advanced) which were held during the same period. 300 Test Centres were provided for this year. The Question Paper along with the Provisional Answer Key was uploaded on the Consortium Website within two hours after the Test. All the response sheets (answer sheets) of all the candidates were also uploaded on the website which were made accessible to the candidates through their login ids.

### **B) Role of NALSAR in conduct of CLAT – 2020**

Prof. Faizan Mustafa, Vice-Chancellor was the President of Consortium of NLU's during the year 2018-2019. As Vice-Chancellor, NALSAR, he is Ex-Officio member of the Executive Committee of CLAT as per the Bye-Laws. Due to Covid-19, the CLAT -2020 was postponed number of times keeping in mind the safety of the candidates. The NLSIU, Bangalore issued a separate admission notification on September 3, 2020 for the conduct of separate test i.e., NLAT – 2020. The notification further stated that NLSIU will not accept CLAT Scores for admissions during 2020. The emergency meetings of the Executive Committee and the Governing Body of Consortium of NLUs were conducted on September 3 & 4, 2020 respectively and as per the directions of the Executive Committee and Governing Body, Prof. Faizan Mustafa, Vice-Chancellor of NALSAR, was asked to discharge the duties of the Secretary in place of the Vice-Chancellor, NLSIU. Accordingly, Prof. Faizan Mustafa discharged the duties of Secretary and extended full support and cooperation to Prof. Balraj Chauhan, Convenor, President, Executive Committee and Governing Body of Consortium of NLU's for the CLAT – 2020 test, which was

eventually conducted successfully. Prof. Faizan Mustafa also led the legal battle in the Supreme Court and finally Consortium won the case and NLSIU was directed to admit students only through CLAT-2020. NLSIU-NLAT was quashed by the Supreme Court.

During the said period number of meetings of Executive Committee and Governing Body were conducted by NALSAR and each and every decision was taken in consultation with all the members of the concerned bodies. Further, NALSAR extended its support to the Convenor in various matters including conducting the Expert Committee meetings on the objections raised by the candidates which were resolved within the timeline. NALSAR also extended its co-operation in preparation of results and declaration of the same as per the schedule. Due to Covid-19, there was loss of more than four months in the admission process during the year 2020-2021. To prevent spread of corona virus, it was decided to have the online admission process. The Executive Committee was forced to make a very tight schedule to cover the loss of time and completed the admission process online on time. NALSAR after number of meetings with the service providers and the members of Executive Committee developed suitable guidelines for the online admission process and the total admission process by CLAT for 23 NLUs was completed within a short period of 10 days by releasing three lists. It was due to NALSAR's efforts that CLAT-2020 admissions were completed by October 10, 2020 as was directed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court. Due to NALSAR's efforts for the first time online centralized counselling was done in CLAT. The members of the Governing Body of Executive Committee placed on record their appreciation for the support extended by NALSAR in conduct of CLAT-2020 successfully even during the medical emergency situation and even after the NLSIU walked out of CLAT-2020 in the last minute.

**C) Provision of Reservation for OBC under State Quota and Creation of Supernumerary Quota for Foreign Nationals:**

The University was graded as Category – I University as per the UGC (Categorization of Universities (Only) for grant of Graded Autonomy) Regulations, 2018. The University can admit foreign students on merit subject to a maximum of 20% over and above the strength of its approved domestic students. Accordingly, the General Council at its special meeting held on December 14, 2019 based on Clause 4.7 of the said UGC Graded Autonomy Regulations, 2018 had approved provision of 20% of the total seats for admission of foreign nationals to the 5-Year B.A., LL.B., (Hons) and One Year LL.M. programme over and above the sanctioned intake of 120 and 60 respectively. Accordingly, 24 seats for B.A, LL.B., (Hons) and 12 seats for LL.M. programme were offered for foreign nationals during the academic year 2020-2021. The admissions through CLAT for the domestic students were made to the extent of 123 and 63 for the B.A., LL.B., (Hons) and LL.M. programme respectively. It is further stated that among the foreign nationals category seats, separate seats were earmarked for ICCR/ Government of India nominees. The following is the breakup of seats for various categories under foreign nationals category:

Further, the University implemented the percentage of reservation for SC and ST under the Residential Students of Telangana quota as per Government of Telangana State.

#### **D) 5-Year B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) Degree Programme**

##### Admissions (2020-21)

The admissions for the twenty third batch were made through Common Law Admission Test-2020 conducted by Consortium of National Law Universities on September 28, 2020. 139 students were admitted to the B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) degree programme including 61 girls. Out of 139 students, 123 students were admitted through CLAT, 14 students through Foreign National category and 02 students from ICCR. Among the students admitted under Foreign National category, three students are from Nepal, one student from Bangladesh, one student from Malaysia, one student from Canada, one student from Ireland, three students from UK and six students from USA. The remaining 110 students admitted to the course are from 21 different States in the country. The academic session started on October 19, 2020.

### Examinations (2015-2020 Batch)

Due to unprecedented COVID-19 the University was closed from March 14, 2020 in view of the lockdown declared by the Central Government and State Government. The students were requested to go home and the online classes were conducted to complete the pending classes.

At the meeting of the Academic Council held on March 28, 2020, it was decided to conduct online examination for the students but some students expressed their inability to take the online examination.

Considering the situation and in view of the *UGC Guidelines on Examinations and Academic Calendar for the Universities in view of COVID-19 pandemic and subsequent lockdown* on April 29, 2020, the Vice-Chancellor constituted three Committees for the B.A.,LL.B.(Hons.), LL.M. and MBA consisting of Faculty Members along with student representatives to deliberate and recommend the examination and evaluation pattern for the semester January-April, 2020.

The recommendations made by the Committee were placed before the emergency meeting of the Academic Council held on May 16, 2020 and it was resolved that as NALSAR follows a system of continuous evaluation through the semester by requiring students to appear in two exams and do one research assignment in all mandatory courses. And since total evaluation of several Elective Courses and Seminar Papers was already completed, for the remaining subjects, as the evaluation for the 50% marks was already completed, it was resolved to scale up the marks for the remaining 50%. It was also decided that if the upscaling of marks adversely affects the students CGPA, it was decided to consider the overall performance of the students till the previous semester for the award of the marks for the end-semester portion.

The UGC had made two sets of regulations: one in relation to the junior classes and the other for the graduating class. The conduct of the final exam was held essential for the graduating class. Since NALSAR does not have a final exam system of evaluation, the evaluation of all the courses was done on the strength of the offline exams and assignments students had completed before the lockdown combined with exams and assignments which they undertook on an online basis after the lockdown. Subsequently BCI too allowed online examinations.

The B.A.,LL.B.(Hons.) degrees will be awarded to the eligible candidates during the ensuing Convocation of the University.

### **E) One Year LL.M. Degree Programme**

#### Admissions (2020-2021)

Admissions for the 19<sup>th</sup> batch (8<sup>th</sup> batch of the one year LL.M. programme) of the LL.M. Degree programme were made during the year under report through the Common Law Admission Test- 2020 conducted by **Consortium of**

**National Law Universities** on September 28, 2020. 70 students including 33 Girls were admitted at NALSAR. Out of 70 students, 63 students were admitted through CLAT, 01 student through Foreign National category and 06 students from ICCR. The students admitted are from 20 states across the country. Among the students admitted under Foreign National category, two students are from Afghanistan and one student each from South Korea, Srilanka, Ethiopia, Botswana and Guyana.

#### Examinations (2019-2020 batch)

In the Emergency Academic Council meeting held on May 16, 2020 to discuss the UGC Covid- 19 Guidelines of April 29,2020 on the Examination pattern to be adopted by the Universities, for the LL.M. programme, it was decided to conduct the online exam for the mandatory papers and to permit the students online submission and presentation for the seminar courses. The dissertation submission was made online and the same was to be evaluated by the internal examiner appointed by the Vice-Chancellor followed by viva-voce examination. External examiners were appointed wherever necessary.

The LL.M. degrees will be awarded to the eligible candidates during the ensuing Convocation of the University.

#### **F) 2-Year M.B.A. Degree Programme**

The two year full-time campus based M.B.A. Program is offered through Department of Management Studies with major specialization in 'Court Management'/'Corporate Governance'/'Financial Services and Capital Markets' / 'Innovation and Sustainability Management' / Operations Management and minor specialization in 'Marketing Management' /'Human Resource Management' /'Business Regulations'.

Admissions for the 8<sup>th</sup> batch of the MBA for the year 2020-22 were done through CAT/XAT/ CMAT/GMAT/GRE and also NALSAR's Management Eligibility Test – 2020(N-MET). 44 students were admitted including 28 Girls. The classes for the current batch (2020-22) commenced on September 01, 2020.

The Department of Management Studies aims at crafting & delivering "Impact-Driven Education" that provides learners essential skills to solve managerial problems through the application of theory, technology and presence of mind. At the heart of our effort, exists, a drive towards invoking experimentation and the spirit of inquiry. To that effect, the DoMS faculty engages in learner centric pedagogical innovation. Expectation mapping and structured outcomes form the foundation of all programs offered by DoMS, NALSAR.

The Department has acquired an Academic Information System (AIS) to improve student engagement with the course curriculum. The AIS covers features of Notice Board, Online Learning Pedagogy, Online Quizzes and

Forum Board among many other student engagement tools. The Faculty is actively engaged in preparing content to suit the online Pedagogy. The same platform was used during the COVID period to facilitate online teaching and learning.

Under the ongoing '**i-Connect**' Program, the Department has organized 14 '**i-Talk**' sessions with Industry experts covering various functional areas of the management to connect the students with industry to enable them to learn contemporary and relevant business practices.

Progress is a continuous process and it takes effort, dedication and thought. Department of Management Studies in its endeavor for the same has appointed after a rigorous intake procedure some of the best minds to help us achieve our goal of creating thought leaders.

#### EXAMINATIONS (2018-20 BATCH) :

Examinations for the sixth batch of students of MBA 2018-20 were conducted during April, 2020. A total of 50 candidates have become eligible for the award of the MBA Degree.

#### **G) Integrated LL.M.,Ph.D. Programme**

The University received 18 applications for admission to LL.M., Ph.D. Program for the academic year 2020-2021. Out of the 18 candidates, 14 candidates appeared for online exam held on August 1, 2020. NALSAR never compromises on the quality. As none of the candidates qualified the exam, there were no admissions for the LL.M., Ph.D. during the academic year 2020-2021.

#### **H) Ph.D. Degree Programme**

The University received 165 applications for admission to Ph.D. Program for the academic year 2020-2021. Out of the 166 candidates, 105 candidates have qualified UGC NET / JRF and hence, they were exempted from writing the entrance exam. Remaining 60 candidates appeared for written test and only 38 candidates qualified the exam.

There were 22 candidates who had passed the Ph.D. Admission Test in 2019, but their proposals were rejected in the interview. As per the Ph.D. Regulations, the candidates are given one more chance to submit their proposals.

105 candidates who were exempted from taking the Admission Test, 38 candidates who have qualified the Admission Test, 22 candidates of 2019 and 3 candidates of LL.M.,Ph.D. (2019) were asked to submit the Preliminary Proposals. Out of 168 candidates, only 133 candidates submitted their Preliminary Proposals. 1 candidate's proposal was rejected after plagiarism check. Out of the 132 submitted proposals, the Research Committee approved 26 proposals and the selected candidates were asked to give

online presentation before the Research Committee during December 3-5, 2020. **Total 21 candidates were admitted including one Foreign National.**

Research Methodology Workshop organized for the Ph.D. Scholars.

Prof. Amita Dhanda, Prof. N. Vasanthi, Dr. N. Manohar Reddy and other faculty members organized a 2-week long Research Methodology Workshop from February 21-27, 2020. It was attended by 16 scholars. Resource Persons for the said programme include Prof. Faizan Mustafa, Prof. Amita Dhanda, Prof. N. Vasanthi, Dr. T. Kannan, Dr. Manisha Sethi, Dr. Neha Pathakji, Dr. N. Manohar Reddy, Dr. Murli Karnam, Ms. Shagufta Bhangu, Mr. Jagteshwar Singh Sohi, Prof. Tony Blackshield, Prof. Rosemary Huisman, Prof. Bhangya Bhukya, Dr. Shilpaa Anand, Dr. Harathi Vageeshan, Prof. Sheela Prasad, Ms. Anindita Mukherjee & Ms. Aakansha Kumar.

Ph.D. Thesis submitted:

University converted Covid-19 emergencies into an opportunity and speeded up completion of several Ph.Ds. Accordingly Ms. Poorvi Ganjoo, Ms. Prateeksha Sharma, Ms. Chandramathi, Mr. Sudhanshu Kumar and Ms. Ritika Kishore submitted their thesis and on the recommendation by the external examiners, the viva-voce examination were conducted for them and the candidates successfully defended the thesis in the public viva-voce and became eligible for award of the Ph.D. Degree. The Ph.D. Degree will be awarded to them in the ensuing Annual Convocation.

## **I) Directorate of Distance Education**

NALSAR University of Law established as an Institute for Excellence in Law, ranks as a premier Institute in the country with a multidisciplinary approach to Law, offering Graduate, Post Graduate and Research Degrees. The University apart from its residential programmes has established a niche for itself in outreach programmes offering diploma and degree programmes since 2001.

To disseminate knowledge and to provide avenues for the working professionals, the University through its Directorate of Distance Education (NALSAR Proximate Education) has been offering Master's and PG Diploma programmes through Open and Distance Learning mode on emerging and contemporary areas from almost last two decades.

University has been entitled under Category-I as per UGC (Categorisation of Universities (Only) for grant of Graded Autonomy) Regulations, 2018 to offer programmes through Open and Distance Learning (ODL) Mode in 2018 without approval of the UGC, provided it satisfies all the conditions laid down under UGC (ODL) Regulations, 2017 and amendments from time to time.

During the reported year, **Prof. Faizan Mustafa** continued as Officiating Director for DDE.

DDE, NALSAR introduced three new Course Programmes during the Academic Year 2020-21 in addition to the existing thirteen Programmes which were offered in the previous academic year.

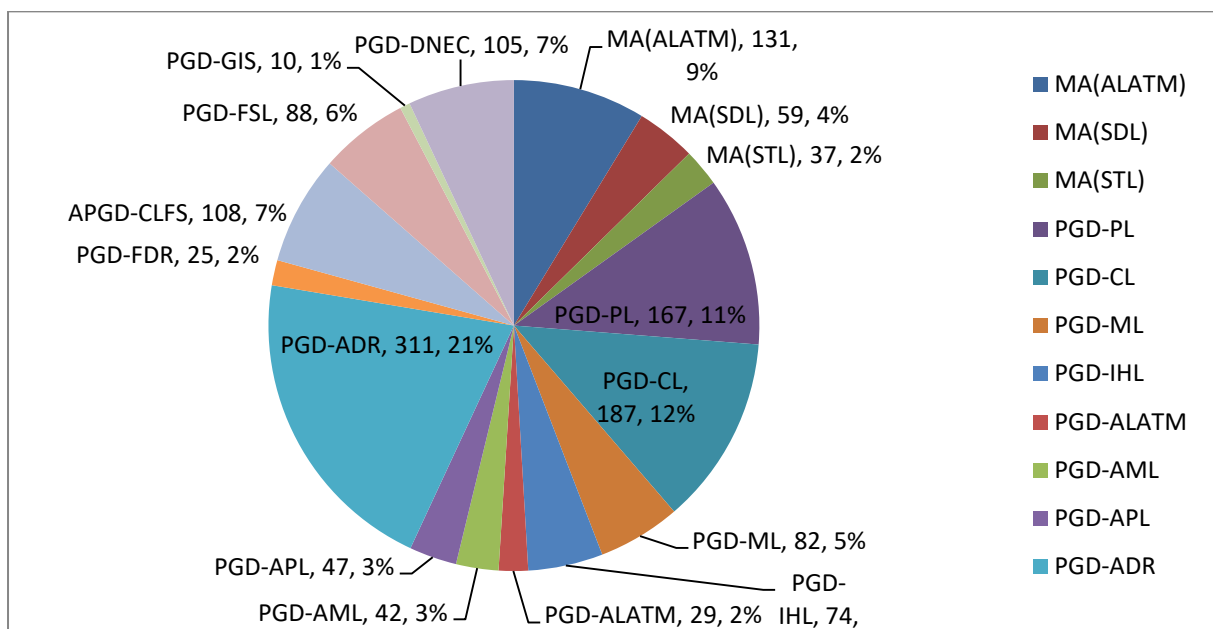

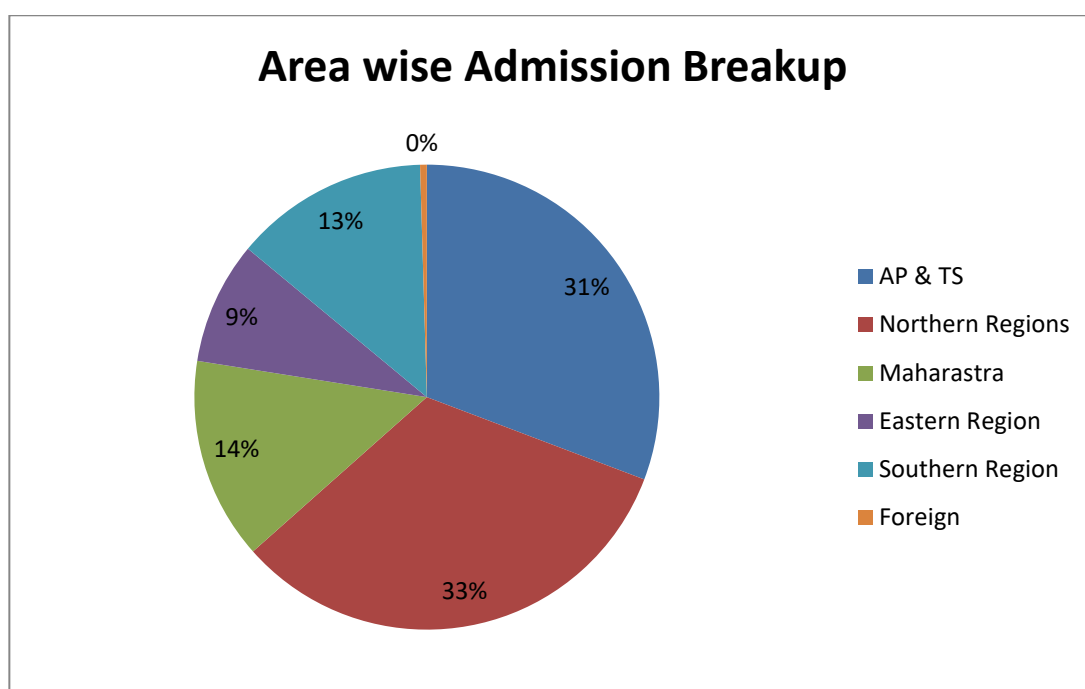

#### Centre for Internal Quality Assurance (CIQA)

During the year under report CIQA meetings were held twice, one on April 25, 2020 and another on June 21, 2020. Both the meetings were held online. During the meeting held in April 2020, the CIQA discussed in detail with regard to the process to be adopted in the unprecedented COVID-19 situation for conduct of online classes and online examinations. The CIQA recommended to the Vice-Chancellor to conduct the classes online only for all the courses offered through DDE till the situation becomes normal. The CIQA considering the fact that the students are not very familiar with the online examination and the University does not have the required infrastructure or expertise to conduct online home proctored examination, the University may consider conduct of the examination as 'take home examination'. The CIQA further recommended that some of the courses where semester pattern is followed, the 30 marks assigned for submission of project / assignment may be scaled up to 50 marks and the end term examination to be conducted as 'take home examination' and be evaluated for 50 marks. In case of the annual pattern examination, the take home examination may be evaluated for 100 marks.

The CIQA further recommended to the Vice-Chancellor that the admission notification may be issued during May or June, 2020. Prof. V. Balakista Reddy, Director, CADL requested the CIQA to recommend offering of the following two courses from the academic year 2020-2021 which were approved by the University Bodies earlier:

- P.G. Diploma in GIS and Remote Sensing Laws
- 2-Year M.A. in Space and Telecommunications Laws

The CIQA recommended to the Vice-Chancellor that the aforementioned two courses may be offered from the academic year 2020-2021. Accordingly, the said courses were offered during the year.

The CIQA meeting was conducted again on June 21, 2020 to consider the proposal of Mr. Rajesh Kapoor to offer the P.G. Diploma in Drafting Negotiation and Enforcement of Contracts from the academic year 2020-2021. The CIQA has considered the proposal and the draft PPR along with the curriculum and recommended to the Vice-Chancellor and the University bodies to approve offering of the said programme from the academic year 2020-2021 after following due process and review of its curriculum by the Expert Committee.

#### Grievance Redressal Committee

University constituted a '**Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC)**' for Directorate of Distance Education, as per the guidelines of UGC (Open and Distance Learning) Regulations, 2017.

During the year under report the University received six grievances through the Grievance Redressal form which was uploaded on the website of DDE and all the Grievances were resolved by the University within reasonable time limit. The grievances submitted were mainly with regard to the grant of extension of time for admission, permission for late submission of required documents etc. One of the grievances also include non-receipt of diploma certificate issued by the University on time which was due to the change in the address of the candidate.

The videos can be accessed with login credentials on DDE website. **Total 520 no.s of lectures were recorded and made available on the website for the enrolled candidates during the year reported above.**

DDE Candidates are also provided with **web based E-platform for remote accessibility of e-resources** subscribed by the university library.

**Feedback** from the enrolled candidates on the Personal Contact programmes and the recorded lectures was collected **through Google Form**.

The Second Round / II Semester Classes are scheduled in Feb-April 2021.

Due to the COVID 19 Pandemic situation in the country and the lockdown restrictions imposed by the Central/State Governments, as per UGC guidelines, University adopted the 'Take Home' mode of examination for the examinations scheduled for the 2019-20 academic session. #### **J. Advance Post-Graduate Diploma in Industrial Security, Law and Management to the trainee Assistant Commandants of NISA**

As per the MoU entered into by NALSAR and National Industrial Security Academy-Central Industrial Security Force on December 6, 2017 the Advance Post-Graduate Diploma in Industrial Security, Law and Management was offered to the trainee Assistant Commandants of NISA.

In the Second batch, 13 Trainee Assistant Commandants were admitted to the Advance P.G. Diploma Programme in September, 2019. The training and the examinations for the said batch were completed by June, 2020.

11 candidates have completed the requisite course requirements and the training and have become eligible for the award of the Advance P.G. Diploma in Industrial Security, Law and Management in the ensuing Annual Convocation.

#### **K. Post-Graduate Diploma in Industrial Security, Law and Management to the Trainee Sub-Inspectors**

As per the MoU with NISA-CISF, the Post-Graduate Diploma in Industrial Security, Law and Management was offered to the Trainee Sub-Inspectors of NISA.

Admissions for the second batch were made during September, 2019 and a total of 53 Trainee Sub-Inspectors were admitted to the P.G. Diploma Programme. 58 candidates (including six candidates of first batch) have completed the course requirements and also the training and have become eligible for award of the P.G. Diploma in Industrial Security, Law and Management.

#### **L. Programmes offered by Cyber Forensic Lab (Ctrl-Z)**

“CTRL-Z” is a state-of-the-art Cyber Forensics academy at “NALSAR” that was established in collaboration with “Cycops Information Security Services”, for conducting long and short term certification courses, seminars and workshops in the fields of Cyber Laws, Cyber Crimes and Cyber Forensic studies for students, police officers and judicial officers etc.

CTRL-Z is equipped with advanced Cyber Forensic equipment, both hardware and software, to help law enforcement authorities and judiciary in the process of digital evidence retrievals, analysis and documentation.

During the year under report, Ctrl-Z conducted the following Certificate programmes/courses:

- 10 days course on Hands on training on Cyber Technologies and Crimes was held from January 12-22, 2020 at National Industrial Security Academy (NISA), CISF

- 3-day course on Hands on Forensic (HOF) was held from February 26-28, 2020.
- 3-day course on Application and Email Forensics (AEF) was held from March 6-8, 2020
- 3-day course on Cyber Investigations Forensics was held from March 13 to 15, 2020

## **8. INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)**

During the year under report, the term of the IQAC was extended by the Vice-Chancellor for one more year w.e.f. April 11, 2020.

### **A) Meetings of the IQAC**

During the year under report the IQAC of NALSAR met four times on March 4, 2020 (physical meeting), May 14, 2020 (Online), September 27, 2020 (Online), October 3, 2020.

The IQAC deliberated on augmentation of research score for the research papers. The IQAC recommended that the University may continue the existing provision wherein the research score may be augmented with some points if the papers published are in the journals ranked by SCImago/ SCOPUS / Web of Science / peer reviewed journals listed by UGC with impact factor (the Impact factor to be determined as per Thomson Reuters / SJR list). The IQAC also recommended that the University should have exclusive research positions to strengthen its research activities.

Due to Covid-19 and subsequent lockdowns declared by Central and State governments, the University was closed in March, 2020. On the recommendations of the IQAC, the University immediately took a decision to conduct online classes so that there will not be any academic loss for the students. The IQAC deliberated in detail on the reports submitted by various Committees appointed by the Vice-Chancellor and recommended the evaluation pattern for the semester January – April, 2020. The IQAC made recommendations to the Academic Council for their approval.

Due to Covid-19 pandemic situation the CLAT – 2020 was postponed number of times by the Consortium of NLU's. However, on the directions of Supreme Court the CLAT -2020 was conducted on September 28, 2020 and the admissions took place during the second week of October 2020 for the first year BA., LL.B., (Hons) and LL.M. Programmes. The IQAC met during September and considering the decision taken by the Core Committee of the Consortium of NLU's recommended conduct of the classes online even for the students of first year BA., LL.B., (Hons) and first year LL.M. Programme. The IQAC also recommended that the as far as possible, the time period lost due to the delay in admissions may be covered by increasing the number of hours in a day and also conducting of classes during Saturdays and holidays to enable to start the second semester during January, 2021 as per the regular schedule. It also recommended the tutorial classes to be used for class lectures.

On the recommendations made by the Vice-Chancellor's of all NLUs and also the Consortium of NLU's, NAAC invited all the Vice-Chancellor's to participate in an online meeting conducted to discuss on the modifications required to give credit to the work undertaken by the NLU's. Accordingly, the IQAC has considered and discussed in detail on the parameters for accreditation mentioned in the existing NAAC manual and made suitable recommendations to the Vice-Chancellor with regard to the modifications required in the NAAC manual. As per the recommendations of the IQAC, NALSAR suggested some modifications in the NAAC manual which were later submitted to NAAC for their consideration.

### **B) Faculty Seminars as part of IQAC**

The following faculty seminar was organized by the IQAC:

- Óutbreak: Foodborne Illness and the Struggle for Food Safety'by Prof. Timothy D. Lytton, Associate Dean for Research and Faculty Development, Distinguished University Professor & Professor of Law, Georgia State University College of Law on January 22, 2020.

### **C) Submission of Annual Quality Assurance Report**

## **10. CAMPUS DEVELOPMENT**

Though during lock down, civil work had to be stopped for several months yet during the year under report, the University has undertaken and completed the following works along with attending to daily complaints received from the students:

- Painting works (Internal & external) Boys Hostel-v & Girls Hostel –V & New Class Rooms, Administrative Block and Academic Block.
- General servicing to all electrical transformer yards and Generators
- Construction of Ramps in front of all Boys Hostel with provisioning of Stainless-Steel Railing to friendly challenged personals.
- Provision of Ground Cables to girls Hostel and faculty quarters
- Renovation of toilets & kitchen in faculty quarters (partly)

- Provision of Air Conditioners to 11 class rooms (i.e., Academic Building – 4 nos, SAARC Law Building – 01, New Class Room-6 Nos) including of provision of separate UG cable from DG Room to Class Rooms.
- Provision of Chain link fencing and improvement electrical infrastructure at Boys Hostel & Girls Hostel Transformer yards.
- Up gradation plantation in Road dividers from main gate to Neem tree jungle.
- Repair / replacement of Electrical, plumbing, wire meshes in hostels and other buildings
- Provision of Seasonal trees in lawn areas in the campus.
- Repairs/Cleaning Sanitary, plumbing and sewage lines in boys and girls hostels
- Repairs to Electrical fitting and fixtures in boys and girls hostels.
- Repairs to Damaged steel cots, tables and chairs in boys and girl hostels
- General maintainace to STP
- Digital display boards were procured and fixed at different places on campus.

**The following major works undertaken by the University are under progress and may be completed by March 2021:**

- Construction of Boys Hostel-VII (multi storied) at NALSAR University of Law, Shameerpet, Hyderabad with capacity of 155 rooms of double occupancy.
- Construction of Girls Hostel-VII (multi storied) at NALSAR University of Law, Shameerpet, Hyderabad with capacity of 183 rooms of double occupancy.
- Construction of expansion of dining hall at NALSAR University of Law, Shameerpet, Hyderabad
- Construction of Primary Health Centre G+2 floors at NALSAR University of Law, Shameerpet, Hyderabad
- Supply of installation of 315 KVA (2nos) transformer's to BH-VII & GH-VII at NALSAR University of Law, Shameerpet, Hyderabad

## **11. LIBRARY**

The NALSAR Library has an independent building in the heart of the campus. It comprises three floors spread across an area of 54,323 Sq. Ft. The ground floor is accommodated with Special Reference, Reference, Loan, Search tools, Bare Acts, Current Journals and reading space. The second floor is accommodated with Bound Back Volumes, reading space and enclosure with carrels for students. The third floor is accommodated with MBA books on one side and reading space on other side. All the house keeping activities are automated and are powered by VIRTUA of VTLS Inc. The library upgraded from traditional based server to cloud computing, which gives the flexibility to connect to our database from anywhere at any time. The Library has adopted Radio Frequency Identity (RFID) based solutions for its circulation, management, inventory and security systems. The students are provided with RFID equipped identity cards. The Library is also equipped with an Orientation Room with Projector, Discussion Rooms

and Moot Court Rooms on the first floor. Information about various sections, resources, services and facilities is available at the Library Portal: <https://library.nalsar.ac.in>

## **ACQUISITION**

The total acquisition by the end of this December 2020 was **46343** which includes the regular collection, e-books, MBA, CJHR, CES, Bare Acts, bound back volumes of Periodicals and Donations.

- **Printed Books**

There has been significant growth in the collection of printed resources during the last year. The growth in the printed resources was largely due to the books exhibition held in the month of January. The Publisher like Asia Law House, Oxford University Press, Book Syndicate from Hyderabad and Mohan Law House and Aditya Books from Delhi participated in the exhibition.

New print acquisitions during the last year was **1948** which includes our regular collection, MBA collection, back volumes and donations.

- **E-Books**

The library's acquisition of Electronic books had grown tremendously during the year, and this collections had been very much useful for the students and faculty during the lock down period. The total collection of e-books during last year was **3111**. Apart from the collection of e-books, we also purchased EBC Reader and Proquest on annual renewal bases, which include nearly 2 lakhs e-books.

- **Donations**

The Library expresses its gratitude for generous donations received from its patrons UNHCR, Delhi; NLU, Delhi; Prof. R. K. Mishra , Director IPE Shameerpet; ICRC, Geneva; NALSAR Faculty Members and students etc.

- **Print Periodicals / Journals**

Library continued its renewal of Indian and International periodicals, apart from it existing renewals it also updated its collection with new journals like "**Aviation Update**" and "**Indian Military Review**".

- **E-Databases**

The University renewed its electronic resources like Harvard Business Review, Kluwer Arbitration, LegitQuest, Lexis Advance India Research, Manupatra, Arbitration International 2020, Oxford Arbitration International Archives 1985-1995, Oxford Competition Law (OCL), Oxford Legal Research Library (OLRL), Oxford Report on International Law (ORIL), Oxford Constitutions of the World, SCC Online, Taxmann, Westlaw India,

Westlaw International. Apart from the above E-resources the University subscribed to **Legit Quest**.

- **E-Journals**

The University renewed 11 e-journals like Aviation week, Bar and Bench, Live Law, Contribution to Indian Sociology, Economic and Political weekly, Ex-Cus (CD-rom), Harvard Business Review, Indian Economic and Social History Review, Seminar, Social Scientist and Vikalpa. Apart from the above e-journals we also subscribed to six e-journals, which includes **OUP Arbitration Journal, OUP Arbitration Journal Archieve, Oxford Legal Research Library, Oxford Competition Law, Oxford Constitutions of the World and Oxford Report on International Law** . NALSAR now has best e-resource collection amongst all National Law Universities with an investment of over 6 crores.

The above e-databases and e-journals can be remotely access through web based Ezproxy tool from anywhere in the world.

- **NEWS Papers**

Apart from the above periodicals and journals we are also procuring 15 News papers in three different languages (English, Hindi and Telugu).

- **UN Collection**

As a Depository Library of UNCollection, it has received substantial resources of major organs of UN. The collection is housed in an exclusive location in the first floor.

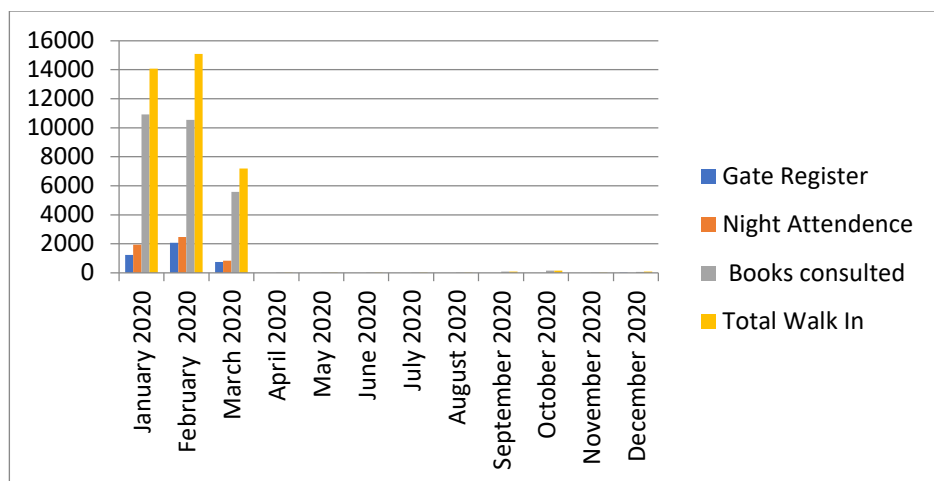

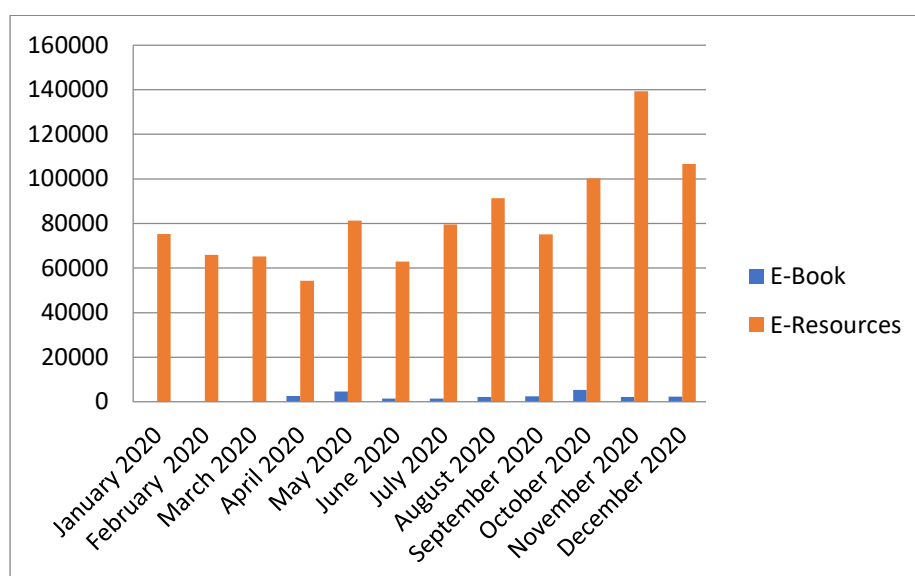

- OPAC Terminals are available in the Library to facilitate browsing of online catalogue, E-Resources etc.
- Bays for Laptops, there are a separate bay for laptop users on the first floor. All the tables are equipped with power sockets for the users.
- Updated list of E-Resources/ Digital resources/Databases are made available online/offline
- The Library is equipped with photocopying, scanning and printing services.
- Locker facility is provided to the users where they can leave their valuable belonging.

The Library with the help of academic committee had procured e-books and e-resources worth more than Rs. 3 crores under the reported year.

## 12. IT INFRASTRUCTURE

### Online Classes using Cisco, WebEx and Google Meet

Due to Covid Lockdown, all the online classes were conducted through Cisco WebEx and Google Meet licenses.

All the said conducted classes were uploaded in centralized database platform called Nalsar forums interface with thread discussion facility for each video uploaded by the teacher.

The Nalsar forums is device independent, responsive and Augmented reality platform which collates and populates the responses on the thread to the already clustered courses and programmes

Live streaming of Cisco WebEx and Google Meet classes/webinar/conferences/meetings are integrated with university social media handles like Facebook, YouTube and live streamed concurrently for farther outreach of the university programmes on digital space.

### NALSAR YouTube Channel

Continuing the initiation of enhancing the digital presence of the University, the official YouTube channel bearing the name 'NALSAR University of Law' has been updated by uploading recordings of guest lectures as well as sessions that are part of conferences, workshops, training programmes. Some of the guest lectures were planned with the help of student groups. It must also be highlighted that the University also uploaded the recordings of the short courses taught by foreign experts. As of now, there are more than 600 videos available on this channel, with nearly **40,000 subscribers and Two Million views. In the year 2020 itself, there were 12,000 new subscribers and One Million views to the channel.** We are thus helping students of other law schools and colleges and contributing to Continuing Legal Education even for lawyers and judges. In the coming years, the University aims to upload more content which will help us in the dissemination

## **13. HEALTH CENTRE**

Due to Covid-19 pandemic situation and subsequent lockdowns, the students were sent back to their homes from campus from March 2020. Foreign Nationals and only few students facing difficulty in accessing online classes were allowed on campus. From March 16 to July, 2020 except Health centre the entire institution was closed.

During this period health staff was engaged to educate the staff members and their families regarding Covid-19 infection and its prevention. Under the guidance of the Health Centre the campus was sanitized with Sodium Hypo chloride. The face masks and hand wash sanitizer were supplied to the staff members and visitors.

#### **14. COUNSELING CENTRE**

The NALSAR Counseling Center has two qualified and experienced Counsellors who conduct individual counseling sessions for the students and staff. In addition, the Counsellors also conduct Art Therapy sessions for the students to help the students to get in touch with their creative energy and distress.

Prior to the pandemic, individual Counseling services were provided to the students on campus. Students were able to approach the counselors with their personal difficulties pertaining to adjustment to college life and academics.

The Covid-19 pandemic is unprecedented for all of us and presented some unique challenges hitherto unknown. As the situation continues unabated, the impending crisis of the Students Mental well-being is a challenge for many educational institutions.

As the uncertainty grew students faced a decrease in resiliency, a decrease in wellbeing and lower motivation. It was natural for students to develop feelings of distress, heightened anxiety and fear, owing to concerns over their health, studies, Internships and social isolation with no clear end in sight.

University reached out to its students by extending online counseling services on audio/video, email or chats during the COVID -19 periods. Online art therapy sessions were also conducted.

The total number of students who reached out for support in the year 2020 to the Counselors were around 115 including staff.

In addition to the individual sessions Counselors provided Covid related workshops to the MBA students. Two different sessions were conducted for first year students on Mental health. One workshop was open to all nalsar students to interact with the counselors to provide coping strategies for their difficulties.

## 15. ADVANCE RESEARCH CENTRES / CHAIRS

### **Revision of the existing centres and establishment of new research centres & designating the faculty members assigned the research centres**

The Academic Council and the Executive Council at their meetings held on March 7, 2017 and March 15, 2017 respectively reviewed and revised the then existing centres and approved establishment of 15 (Fifteen) Centres and 04 (Four) Departments. Further, the Councils also approved designating the Professors / Associate Professors who are assigned to the Centres as Centre Head and the Assistant Professors who are assigned to the Centres as Centre Incharge.

During the year under report, the Executive Council at its meeting held on July 01, 2020 approved designating the persons appointed for Research Centres as Director. Further, as authorised by the Executive Council, the Vice-Chancellor approved designating the Assistant Professors appointed for the Centres as Centre Coordinators. Hence, the Professors and Associate Professors appointed for Research Centres are designated as Director and the Assistant Professors are designated as Coordinators.

Further after reviewing the existing centres and after considering the fact that there is a need to have separate centres for Consumer Laws to undertake the activities of the Consumer Chair and for Tax Laws for undertaking in depth research activities in the Tax Laws, the Centre for Corporate Law and Taxation Laws & Centre for Consumer and Competition Laws were bifurcated and the following Centres were established in their place:

- 1) Centre for Consumer Laws
- 2) Centre for Tax Laws
- 3) Centre for Corporate and Competition Laws

In addition, the following Centres were also established for undertaking researches and also to offer courses in the relevant areas of specialisation:

- 1) Centre for Cyber Laws and Forensic Sciences
- 2) Centre for Law, Entrepreneurship and Action Research
- 3) Centre for Commercial Law and Dispute Resolution
- 4) Centre for Management Studies (as part of Department of Management Studies)

**C) Centre for Constitutional Law, Policy and Good Governance  
(Centre Head: Prof. N. Vasanthi, Professor of Law)**

- During the year, the centre finalised the **IJCL Journal Vol. 9** for publishing on 14th Aug 2020
- The Centre **organized a Conference on 'The Courts and the Constitution – 2019 in Review' on January 25-26, 2020**. This conference was organised collaboratively by the 'Centre for Constitutional Law, Policy and Good Governance, NALSAR', the 'School of Policy and Governance, Azim Premji University' and the editorial team of the 'Law and Other Things' Blog. Spread over two days, the conference consisted of seven substantive sessions and featured presentations by 25 invited speakers that included several legal practitioners, academics, journalists and independent researchers. The main objective was to review developments in the field of Indian Constitutional Law during the calendar year 2019. The proceedings were attended by an audience of nearly 150 participants, which included students from NALSAR, APU, SLS-Hyderabad, Osmania University and several other external visitors.

**D) Centre for Animal Rights**  
**(Centre Head: Dr. Aruna B Venkat, Associate Professor of Law)**  
**(Mr. Vivek Mukherjee, Assistant Professor, Co-ordinator, P.G. Diploma**  
**in Animal Protection Laws)**

- The Centre organised an online webinar series on Animal Laws in India on 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2020 with the theme “Illegal Wildlife Trade and its Role in Zoonotic Disease Transmission”. The speakers for the webinar were: Mridula Vijayraghavan who works with WCS-India as the Legal Director with a focus on wildlife law and Sumanth Bindumadhav who is the Campaign Manager for Wildlife at Humane Society International/India and has more than 20 years of experience in the field. More than 50 participants from different backgrounds participated in the webinar.

Research Projects

The centre is currently involved in 3 research projects:

- A project on ‘**Legal Personhood of Elephants in India**’ in collaboration with Nonhuman Rights Project, USA.

**Description:** The main objective of the project is to file a petition for the recognition of the personhood of our client in a suitable High Court or the Supreme Court. At this stage, we are yet to decide who our client (most probably an elephant or a chimpanzee) will be and which court is most suitable for our petition. Mr. Raj Panjwani (who is a senior advocate at the Supreme Court and has been a champion of animal rights for decades) has agreed to be the lead counsel.

**Funding agency:** NhRP, USA.

**Duration:** 1.5 years approx.

**Status:** Ongoing.

- A funded project on ‘**Illegal Wildlife Trade and Zoonotic Diseases**’ with Harvard Animal Law and Policy Program;

**Description:** One primary goal of our paper is to provide a sense of the diversity in types and cultural functions of markets, as well as the regulatory frameworks that govern them. We are selecting, as part of this process, a handful of countries to serve as “case studies” that capture this detail and allow for a deeper dive into the specifics of a particular country’s markets. We hope these case studies, when taken together, will prove the reader a sense of how animal markets may vary from one region to the next as well as what types of regulatory schemes and policies govern markets around the globe. NALSAR has signed a general MOU which includes this project and future projects that ALC & ALPP, Harvard may take up collaboratively.

**Collaborators:** This project is led by the Harvard Animal Law & Policy Program, New York University’s Center for Environmental and Animal

Protection, University of Denver's Sturm College of Law, Lewis & Clark Law School's Center for Animal Law Studies, the University of Toronto Faculty of Law, the University of Victoria Faculty of Law, and Yale Law School's Law, Ethics & Animals Program. It is funded by the Brooks Animal Studies Academic Network. Outside of North America, we will be working with collaborators across the world who will oversee the country-specific "case study" portion of the research. It is our hope that collaborators will share information and ideas amongst themselves, such that one of the lasting effects of this project will be a closer network of dedicated professionals working on One Health issues.

- A funded research project on '**Farm Animal Protection**' in collaboration with Humane Society International, India.

**Description:** This paper series aims to increase insight into the following: How the current system of battery cages and treating the birds as —production unitsll leads to immense harm not only to the birds but also to the labour and other humans in and around the poultry farms on a regular basis. How intensive confinement has an adverse impact on not only the animals but also causes a wide range of problems for our environment. The waste is released to our water bodies without any treatment. Our water and air quality are drastically compromised because of these industries. Studies have found that the workers of poultry farm report a more frequent occurrence of —headache, runny nose, sore throat, excessive coughing, diarrhoea, burning eyes, chest tightness. The prevalence of child labour, bonded labour and other labour rights violation in the visited poultry industries. What are the immediate measures that the poultry industry would need to take in order to improve the working conditions and address the existent human rights violations?

**Status:** This year we have completed two papers: **Environment Paper:** Studying the ecological risk associated with egg production through insights gained from 20 to 30 facilities. To study sustainable models of egg production to show a way forward for the sector. To produce a chemical and carbon footprint profile for eggs in two major cities (Hyderabad and Vizag). **Public Health Paper:** Studying the Public health risks associated with egg production by building a health profile of people living in and near the facilities. To build a health profile of people living in zones where egg production is concentrated by partnering with public health agencies and local doctors. To produce a biological threat profile of egg production.

- Sent the first draft of the labour paper for internal and external review.
- Worked with spreading the press releases across the Print media about the Animal Protection Law PgD program of 2020-2021.
- Co-ordinated with the IT department and reached out to prospective students over follow-up calls to ensure that their admission process is streamlined. Also coordinated with the team in processing and following up with students who were offered scholarships.
- Worked on adding citations and refining the references for the true cost of eggs - Labour paper
- Began restructuring the Labour paper into the requisite format.
- Worked with the IT team and coordinated with the students leading up to the first round of classes for the APL 2020 - 2021 batch. Made sure that the contact classes went through without hurdles across the four days.
- Began Restructuring the True cost of eggs - Animal Welfare paper by integrating recent research carried out in the field.
- Started coordinating the Animal Law webinar series with SNHP collaboration and ensured that the communication between the conversers and the speakers were going as per schedule. Also helped in collating and doing secondary research for the "First Strike" white paper.

### Webinars:

It was held on June 30, 2020.
- (b) Mapping India’s Defence and Security Challenges: A Way Forward  
As part of “Atmanirbhar Bharat”, and to push towards self-reliant India, Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, has announced significant structural reforms in major Sectors including the Defence. An inevitable outcome of these reforms is the Private Participation in the Defence Industry. Subsequent to the hugely successful inaugural session on June 30, 2020, the 2nd Webinar of the series titled “Mapping India’s Defence and Security Challenges: A Way Forward” was organized on July 7, 2020.

(c) Impact of COVID-19 on the Indian Aviation Industry

The impact of COVID-19 is for real and this unprecedented health crisis is pushing the global economy into a turmoil. The aviation sector, predominantly airlines and airports are very badly hit due to this pandemic. The International Air transport Association estimates that the global aviation industry will lose \$252 billion in 2020. Some analysis shows that the overall drop in global GDP is 6% due to this pandemic and because of the several restrictions imposed by the governments. With these circumstances in mind, CADL has scheduled its 3rd Webinar in “Aerospace and Defence Law Lecture Series” titled “*Impact of COVID-19 on the Indian Aviation Industry*” on July 12, 2020, at 3:30 PM IST.

(d) Unlocking India’s Private Sector Legal and Policy Challenges

With the aim to attain long-time technological, economic and industrial gains, the Indian government has opened its space sector to private players and also intends to set- up a new organisation, namely, The Indian National Space Promotion and Authorisation Centre (In-Space). In addition, the discussions on the Space Activities Bill of 2017 is still ongoing. This means that going forward we could expect an economic contribution from this sector to the GDP as these legal and policy initiatives may enable growth of the space sector activities in India. To further look into this development and get insights from the prominent persons from the Space sector, CADL has scheduled its 4th Webinar in “Aerospace and Defence Law Lecture Series” titled “*Unlocking India’s Private Space Sector: Legal and Policy Challenges*” on July 19, 2020 at 3:30PM IST.

(e) Application of GIS and Remote Sensing Technologies: Trends and Prospects

This spatial component is used in various sectors including the location-based infrastructure, Disaster management, agriculture, environment assessment, health care, e-governance and many more. Research reveals that the global spatial market has an estimated value of USD 78 million, thriving at a CAGR of 16.6% during the assessment period from 2016 through 2022. With this in mind, CADL, NALSAR University of Law held webinar in “Aerospace and Defence Law Lecture Series” titled “Application of GIS and Remote Sensing Technologies: Trends and Prospects” on Saturday, 25th July 2020 at 5:00 PM IST.

(f) India as a maritime power: Contemporary perspectives

With all the contemporary issues, Our panellists in the Webinar “India as a maritime power: Contemporary perspectives”, the last of the “Aerospace and Defence Laws lecture series”, addressed some of them on 31st July 2020 at 5:00 PM.

#### **F) Centre for Tribal and Land Rights**

**(Centre Head : Prof. V. Balakista Reddy, Professor of Law)**

- Guided the Farmers association namely Radhakrishna Kuruma Sanghamam of Mangole Village of Kondapaka Village of Siddipet District, an extent of Ac 50.10 gts of land was acquired for Mission Bagheeratha purpose by Telangana State Government through Telangana State Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Rules, 2014 in this regard made them to aware of legal provisions and their rights with regard to the property accordingly compensation was negotiated with the appropriate officials and enhanced compensation was being awarded peacefully without any chaos and agitations.
- Gadila Lakshmi W/ o Gadila Shankariah land around 2.00 Acres of land situated at Baswapur ijara Vilage of Mulugu Mandal of Siddipet District, a poor old aged widow lady cultivating land without having proper documents in her hand, there were several disputes since last 3 years, there were many provocations and tensions by few of same villagers were tried through illegal means and force to grab the land and enjoy, but timely suggestions and legal actions made them to protect their land, on behalf of them several applications was drafted and filed before appropriate authorities to take necessary actions, still those were pursuing on time to time basis.
- New Narsimha Nagar Cooperative Society of Mallapur of Nacharam, Hyderabad it's been almost 30 years since they have been fighting for their land ownership right, as a Residential Zone from Railway Transportation Zone and thereby can help nearly 800 households, more than 5000 people in the region. While it is thoroughly noticeable that, every single owner has been paying Property Tax, Electricity & Water bills quite persistently and also paid payments towards LRS in the recent times, yet their survey number has been classified as a non-residential zone by the HMDA and their Survey numbers are not included in recently developed Dharani Portal. In this regard CTRLR given initial steps to be followed accordingly applications were drafted and helped the residents of association.
- Guided Several High Court Civil Litigation Matters to Tahsildars of Telangana State with regard to subjudice matters, Bindover cases during Election Code, Contempt Petitions, against Tahsildars and helped them to understand the nature of litigation and grounds of facts with legal relevance.

- Centre for Tribal and Land Rights (CTLR), NALSAR University of Law, Hyderabad is continuously guiding the illiterate, poor, and needy people who approach the CTLR on their property matters, legal and litigation matters on time-to-time basis. Further drafting the legal petitions and applications to the illiterate poor people.
- Centre for Tribal and Land Rights (CTLR), NALSAR University of Law, Hyderabad is trying hard to bring out its Exclusive Activities Report under the esteemed stewardship of Centre Head Prof. (Dr) V. **H. Centre for Criminal Justice Reform and Research  
(Centre In-Charge: Dr. Manisha Sethi, Associate Professor)**

The Centre has been newly established in 2020 with the objective to explicate the link between citizenship, rights and processes of law. It will also seek to identify systemic and structural problems within the criminal justice system, and to act as a platform for policy and reform initiatives in this regard. Some of the key areas of research at the Centre will be in the following fields:

- Special legislation, more specifically anti-terror and public detention laws
- Wrongful prosecution and convictions; evolving framework of compensation and rehabilitation
- Death penalty
- Prison studies

The Centre is intended to be home to a range of taught courses that will provide students a theoretical foundation to engage with these issues. With this in mind, two social science seminar papers were introduced: 'Emergency Jurisprudence' (Jan- April 2020) and 'Terrorism Trials' (July-November 2020).

In order to supplement these theoretical discussions with insights from the everyday world of the criminal justice system, a series of invited lectures was initiated. These included:

- '*Unlawful Activities Prevention Act and the Pathologies of Law*' by Adv. Jawahar Raja, August 11, 2020. Raja has represented terror accused, as well as defended organisations that were banned under UAPA. Raja's talk focussed on the problematic of the executive's power of proscribing organisations and its consequences for the right to freedom of speech and association.
- '*Terrorism Trials and Reflections on Fundamental Rights*' by Justice (Retd.) Abhya Thipsay, August 18, 2020. Justice Thipsay, whose landmark observations in the Kabir Kala Manch bail order have been hailed as 'transformative' and the most lucid judicial resistance to the executive tendency to abridge civil liberties in the name of exception, deconstructed UAPA and MCOCA.
- '*Guilty until Proven Innocent: A view from the Dock*' by Wahid Shaikh, August 26, 2020. Shaikh spent close to nine years in prison on terror charges and has authored 'Begunah Qaidi' (Innocent Prisoners), and has recently completed another book, *A Fair Trial?* which will take us through the nitty gritty of a MCOCA court. In his talk, Shaikh drew upon his own experience as an accused to demonstrate how all legal maxims are parodied and vitiated in a terrorism trial. His talk also indicated how, even in the face of apparent prejudicial legal process; we must also focus on what Annelise Riles has called the 'technicalities of law'.

The lecture series will be continued over the current semester.

The Centre will also serve as a repository, and the task of collecting records, reports and documents pertaining to all aspects of the functioning of the criminal justice system – produced by both governmental and non governmental sources – has already begun. The archive will be a valuable source for scholars.

## Internships

NALSAR believes that learning is not done in the classroom alone but also at place of work. - A project on Legal Personhood of Elephants in India in collaboration with Nonhuman Rights Project, USA. **Description:** The main objective of the project is to file a petition for the recognition of the personhood of our client in a suitable High Court or the Supreme Court. At this stage, we are yet to decide who our client (most probably an elephant or a chimpanzee) will be and which court is most suitable for our petition. Mr. Raj Panjwani (who is a senior advocate at the Supreme Court and has been a champion of animal rights for decades) has agreed to be the lead counsel. **Funding agency:** NhRP, USA. **Duration:** 1.5 years approx. **Status:** Ongoing.
- A funded project on Illegal Wildlife Trade and Zoonotic Diseases with Harvard Animal Law and Policy Program; **Description:** One primary goal of our paper is to provide a sense of the diversity in types and cultural functions of markets, as well as the regulatory frameworks that govern them. We are selecting, as part of this process, a handful of countries to serve as “case studies” that capture this detail and allow for a deeper dive into the specifics of a particular country’s markets. We hope these case studies, when taken together, will prove the reader a sense of how animal markets may vary from one region to the next as well as what types of regulatory schemes and policies govern markets around the globe. NALSAR has signed a general MOU which includes this project and future projects that ALC & ALPP, Harvard may take up collaboratively. **Collaborators:** This project is led by the Harvard Animal Law & Policy Program, New York University’s Center for Environmental and Animal Protection, University of Denver’s Sturm College of Law, Lewis & Clark Law School’s Center for Animal Law Studies, the University of Toronto Faculty of Law, the University of Victoria Faculty of Law, and Yale Law

School's Law, Ethics & Animals Program. It is funded by the Brooks Animal Studies Academic Network. Outside of North America, we will be working with collaborators across the world who will oversee the country-specific "case study" portion of the research. It is our hope that collaborators will share information and ideas amongst themselves, such that one of the lasting effects of this project will be a closer network of dedicated professionals working on One Health issues.

- A funded research project on Farm Animal Protection in collaboration with Humane Society International, India. **Description:** This paper series aims to increase insight into the following: How the current system of battery cages and treating the birds as —production unitsll leads to immense harm not only to the birds but also to the labour and other humans in and around the poultry farms on a regular basis. How intensive confinement has an adverse impact on not only the animals but also causes a wide range of problems for our environment. The waste is released to our water bodies without any treatment. Our water and air quality are drastically compromised because of these industries. Studies have found that the workers of poultry farm report a more frequent occurrence of —headache, runny nose, sore throat, excessive coughing, diarrhoea, burning eyes, chest tightness. The prevalence of child labour, bonded labour and other labour rights violation in the visited poultry industries. What are the immediate measures that the poultry industry would need to take in order to improve the working conditions and address the existent human rights violations? **Status:** This year we have completed two papers: **Environment Paper:** Studying the ecological risk associated with egg production through insights gained from 20 to 30 facilities. To study sustainable models of egg production to show a way forward for the sector. To produce a chemical and carbon footprint profile for eggs in two major cities (Hyderabad and Vizag). **Public Health Paper:** Studying the Public health risks associated with egg production by building a health profile of people living in and near the facilities. To build a health profile of people living in zones where egg production is concentrated by partnering with public health agencies and local doctors. To produce a biological threat profile of egg production.

## **22. STUDENTS ACCOMPLISHMENTS / ACHIEVEMENTS**

### **A) Student Bar Council**

The elections to the Student Bar Council were held on January 2, 2021. Eleven functional committees, viz., Academic, Alternative Dispute Resolution, Moot Court, Literary and Quizzing, Cultural and Fine arts, Mess and Hospitality, Hostel and Campus welfare, Debating, Sports, Social Responsibility and Student Welfare and the Board of Auditors were elected. The new office bearers for the year took oath of office on January 2, 2021.

Usually, the elections to the Student Bar Council take place in a physical format. Students cast votes in ballot boxes in their respective classrooms and the indirect elections to the posts of Executive Council and Convenor of each committee are held post this.

This year, due to the Pandemic, the University is functioning in an online format. The elections to the SBC could not be carried out in a physical format. Student Bar Council plays an important part to ensure constructive

dialogue between the university administration and the students and it represents student interests to the administration, thus it is necessary to conduct elections to the SBC. The university adapted to the situation and the entire process was conducted online. The university made required changes to the SBC Election Notification to accommodate the online election process. After analysing different methods by which the election could be conducted online, the university decided to do it via Google Forms.

The university collected the email IDs of each student and the election was conducted via Google Forms. A form for each contested post was released and students were to vote accordingly. The indirect elections to the post of Convenors were conducted on a Google Meet call. **The entire procedure followed in normal elections was complied with, and the process was successfully conducted online.**

The office bearers of the SBC for the year 2020-21 are Sushrut Kaplay (President), Nikhil Chainani (Vice-President), Ashish K James (General Secretary-Male), Ankita Gupta (General Secretary-Female), Aviral Agrawal (Joint Secretary-Male), Aditi Nazre (Joint Secretary-Female) and Mohit Kala (Treasurer).

## **B. ACADEMIC COMMITTEE**

During the year under report (2020-21), the Academic Committee undertook the following activities:

- The Academic Committee has worked with the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor and the Library Committee to purchase books and e-resources worth Three Crores for 2020-21.
- The Academic Committee has worked together with the IT Department and the Library to launch an upgraded website for the Library, known as the "NALSAR e-Library" which can be accessed at [library.nalsar.ac.in](http://library.nalsar.ac.in).
- The Committee has procured access for Coursera for the University for the year 2020-21 and has given access to the courses offered under the same to the student body.
- The Committee has built the "NALSAR Forums" Website, in order to facilitate online teaching and learning. The same can be accessed at [nalsar.ac.in/forums](http://nalsar.ac.in/forums). The Committee, along with the SRSWC has also established the "NALSAR Forums Committee", an ad-hoc committee under Article 25 of the SBC Constitution.
- The Committee has worked with the administration to dispatch pen drives for students with internet access difficulties for the Even and the Odd Semesters of 2020, and has worked with the administration to iron out the issues.

#### **SPECIAL NOTE ON NALSAR FORUMS:**

- NALSAR Forums [<https://nalsar.ac.in/forums/>] is a website which is currently being used by both the B.A.LL.B (Hons.) and the LLM batches for accessing the recordings of the classes, course materials, as well as for any discussion with professors and students, both academic and

otherwise. As of writing this report, Forums currently has 765 registered users, and more than 5000 media files, which includes classes, course materials as well as discussions on topics as diverse as philosophy and Maggi recipes.

- NALSAR Forums is the brainchild of the SBC Academic Committee of 2019-20 and has been completely built in-house, and is built on the Wordpress platform and hosted on NALSAR's servers. While the administration was preparing a plan for the online semester, the SBC Academic Committee was looking at various options to bridge the gap between the teachers and the students, both in terms of communications and discussion, in an attempt to make up for the lack of physical interaction due to the online mode of education. Work on this site first started on the 13th of May 2020, where a trial run was conducted on NALSAR's eLibrary Website ([library.nalsar.ac.in](http://library.nalsar.ac.in)) and the SBC Academic Committee received the permission and the current home of Forums was granted to the Committee on the 16th of May 2021. Within three days, the Committee had managed to set the basic structure of the Forums, with rudimentary designs, and many of the features which were released over the course of time, still missing.
- On the 19th of May 2020, the Committee decided to bring on board some of our fellow students as Beta Testers, so that the Committee could get in suggestions, and also check the website for bugs. For one tireless month, both the Committee and the Beta Testers worked on the website, adding more capabilities, and necessary features and functionalities for an online semester.
- The first ever public Forum went live for the ICC discussions for the Batch of 2022 on 25th June 2020 at 8:15 PM. Final preparations were made for its official release to the whole of student body, and each student and faculty was given their own Forums Account using their NALSAR Email IDs, and Forums were created for every subject, including the Electives and the Social Science Seminars, with dedicated topic threads for the easy uploading of material. The website was finally released to the public on the 30th of June, 2020. An Android Application was also developed and released on the Google Play Store. A Progressive Web App was developed and released for iOS and iPadOS users.
- Despite *initial hiccups*, students and teachers had accustomed themselves to the structure of Forums. Students could subscribe to the courses which they were enrolled in, and would receive email notifications whenever new content was put up in the particular subject. Due to increasing use of the Forums, the Committee had also worked with the IT Department to upgrade our servers, to a higher capacity one, to meet with the increasing demands.
- The Forums has various features which helps reach its objective, such as multiple file uploading, threaded replies, private messaging, user

notifications, email communications when subscribed, as well as dedicated Forums for the various Committees under the Student Bar Council for announcements and other Committee related materials. Forums has also been used by Committees for discussions with students surrounding policy consultations which were hosted by the Committees.

- By the end of the online semester of July - October 2020, approximately 3000 files were uploaded onto Forums. Due to the increasing usage of Forums, the SBC Academic Committee along with our friend at the Social Responsibility and Students Welfare Committee [SRSWC] established the NALSAR Forums Committee for the Batch of 2025 on 17th November 2020, with five members to deal with the uploads and the technical aspects of the Forums. Soon, looking at the success of this model, the NALSAR Forums Committee was soon expanded to add students from all batches, and currently has a strength of 19 students, including two volunteers from the LLM Batch.
- Currently, the NALSAR Forums is being maintained by the SBC Academic Committee, the SRSWC and the NALSAR Forums Committee, along with help from the IT Department of NALSAR as well as our Server Team at Flying Stars.
- The creation of the website would not have been possible without the hard work, effort and dedication of some of our fellow students such as Mr. DGV Rothvik, Ashish K James and others and staff at NALSAR. Mr. B. Mohd Irfan and Mr. Tariq Ali from NALSAR's IT Department have helped the Committee set up the website on the server end, helped by Mr. Navneet Deshpande from the Server Team. Prof. Amita Dhanda, the former Convenor of the Academic Examination Committee has helped tremendously in the adoption of Forums amongst the teachers, tirelessly working with the SBC Academic Committee. Ashish K James and DGV Rithvik from the SBC Academic Committee had conceptualised and had set up the website. Yashwanth Samayam from the SRSWC has been a constant support for the SBC Academic Committee for the maintenance of the website.

- As the online semester continues, NALSAR Forums remains to be one of the crucial components of NALSAR's Online Education during the pandemic and beyond, and despite "initial hiccups and various issues", the Committees have worked together to keep the website running, and will continue to work on the website till the end of the online semesters.

## G. SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY AND STUDENT WELFARE COMMITTEE

The main aim of the Social Responsibility and Student Welfare Committee is reflected from its name, some of the major duties include the maintenance of internet and related infrastructure on campus, overseeing the student orientation and mentor-mentee programmes, to provide logistical and financial support to legal aid activities and ensuring the maintenance of healthcare and related services on campus. These responsibilities, along with others have been laid down in Article 21 of the Student Bar Council Constitution.

In the Semester which ran from July-October 2019 till December 2020 the committee undertook the following major tasks:

**Purchase of Books and E-Book Bank:** Purchase of law textbooks too was done utilising the SBC budget, and distributed to students from various years. The SRSWC started the NALSAR e-book Database in the July-October 2019 semester by creating a repository of the e-books for the mandatory subjects. The project was expanded with a collaboration with the Academic Committee and we digitised half of the proposed list of books, with the rest of the list to be finished in the subsequent year. During the lockdown the committee utilized the part of the remaining budget, to purchase and deliver books for some mandatory subjects for Visually-Challenged students.

**Purchase of Laptops:** The SRSWC ensured distribution and maintenance of the university's laptop bank for the students to use during emergencies coordinated with the IT Department to ensure that the university purchased additional laptops for the students to use in emergencies.

**Upgradation of IT Infrastructure:** The SRSWC coordinated with the IT Department, to identify areas where Internet connectivity issues exist. The IT Department installed LAN ports and Cables in the Moot Rooms in the Library. The IT Department purchased additional routers to be installed at various points of the university. The SRSWC also distributed LAN cables to the students for use in hostels.

**Cycles on Campus:** Cycles on campus (which are rented out for a nominal amount) were repaired several times and purchase of new cycles from the annual SBC budget was made. The SRSWC redistributed the number of cycles among the hostel complexes of the campus. The committee ensured that an equal number of cycles are present in the BH complex and GH complex. Further the committee prepared and submitted a proposal and acquired permissions for the engineering department to construct a bicycle shed near the GH complex.

**Scholarship Programme:** The SRSWC requested the VC to increase the scholarship corpus for the academic year 2020-2021, especially hardships that the COVID-19 Pandemic has created. The administration has agreed to increase the corpus from an amount of 35 lakh Rupees to 75 lakh Rupees. The SRSWC also undertook an orientation session with the batch of 2025 on University Scholarship, and External Scholarships.

**Merchandise:** The committee procured merchandise for the students and subsidise the purchase of the same. The committee shall complete the delivery of the merchandise to the students once the campus reopens.

**Clothes Collection Drive:** The SRSWC conducted a clothes collection drive in collaboration with Goonj Foundation

**Healthcare:** The SRSWC ensured that wheelchairs and crutches, procured for injured persons were available at the guard rooms and hostels as necessary.

**Blood Donation Drive:** The SRSWC during the month of February 2020, In coordination with some students and Jivitasha Organisation, the committee organised the Blood Donation Drive, which was shown enthusiasm on part of the campus residents, which was also appreciated by the volunteers from the Aarohi Blood Bank. The committee was assisted by Bhaskar Anna in providing refreshments for the participants of the drive which were reimbursed by the committee.

**Legal Aid:** The committee also ensured the provision of funds for the NALSAR Legal Aid Group [NLAG] for various legal aid activities. Refer to the NLAG Annual Report for more details.

**Mentorship Programme for the Batch of 2025:** The SRSWC revamped the mentorship programme that the committee undertakes, by increasing the number of mentors, especially considering the short semester period and lack of tutorials for the batch of 2025 in their virtual semester.

## H. LITERARY AND QUIZZING COMMITTEE

The 6<sup>th</sup> NALSAR Literary Festival was held online, on the 16th and 17th of January, 2021, centring around the theme “Changing Realities: All Our Yesterdays, Foregone Conclusions and a Brave New World”. As part of the fest, two panel discussions were organised. The first panel discussion was titled “Journalistic Freedom and Free Speech” and discussed the contemporary happenings in the realm of journalistic freedom and the role played by the legislative, judiciary and executive in protecting it. The speakers were Annie Zaidi and Niranjana Takle, and the discussion was moderated by Divya Srinivasan. The second panel discussion was titled “Changing Realities: Stories, Experiences and their Expression”, and focused on highlighting conundrums of the present through storytelling and sharing experiences.
